Family Spotlight: Moore Family



Two teens looking to escape bad home situations and build something better...that would be Harold and Kathleen Moore. Decades later, they're on the verge of achieving their dream— homeownership, but the journey hasn't been without obstacles.

Harold and Kathleen were both raised in upstate New York. Their living situations and family lives were less than stellar, dotted with family members struggling with addictions. Each of them wanted something more, but wasn't sure where to find it. Eventually they found Jesus...and each other, which turned out to be a winning combination. They married and were determined to have a different family life than the ones they had personally experienced. They desperately wanted to be self-sufficient and not dependent on others for financial support. Their families didn't understand their desire for independence or their newfound faith, and eventually the

Moores moved to Alabama to break away from what they considered "toxic family relationships".

In 2010, life had settled down, and both Harold and Kathleen were working full time jobs. A rare infection suddenly struck Harold, resulting in 2 emergency surgeries in one day. He was back to work in 2 months, but the physical trauma gradually took its toll, resulting in full blown kidney failure a year later. Kathleen became his caretaker, administering dialysis at home multiple times per week. In addition to a decrease in income and rising medical bills, the Moores were paying more than a third of their monthly income for rent and utilities. The house where they lived was old and in disrepair—a problem that exacerbated Harold's health issues. When they heard about Habitat, they thought, "Let's just go and check it out…" After hearing the details, they were convinced this could be a path to accomplishing a dream. Once their application was approved, they rolled up their sleeves and jumped right in…working on construction sites, attending classes, and documenting how they spent their money. Their teenage son, Michael, has loved the construction experience! He is thrilled to know that not only can he help build the family home, but someday, it will be his after his parents are gone. Now, he's even considering a future career in construction.

Kathleen says having their own home will be "a big, wonderful change for us". It will lift a huge burden off their shoulders and give them a new sense of safety and security. They are looking forward to cookouts on the back patio and Bible studies in the living room. They are so thankful for the things they've learned, the people they've met, and the opportunities they've been given. Their response to the Habitat program: "We've invested, but we've gotten SO much more!"

Harold and Kathleen are eligible to receive a house this spring, but will have to continue to "wait in the wings" until funding becomes available...how can YOU help? Can your church, business, or organization be a financial sponsor? Please call our office to learn more: 256-340-9609.


