We are thrilled to be building 2 houses in Denver Place! We began building a house at 413 Denver Place with homeowner Shannon Johnson and a 10-member team from Harvard on March 13th. Brrr!!! The week began cold and windy. But weather didn't stop our Construction Crew and Harvard from accomplishing their goal of framing the house. Luckily we ended the week sunny and warm. Since then Shannon and the Construction Crew have been joined by Parkview Baptist, Wesley Methodist and Southside Baptist churches. Aggressive groups from Jack Daniels, Daikin and Publix

have added to our progress and more groups will be joining us as construction continues. We plan to dedicate this house in May.

Thanks to a great marketing letter which spurred an extra effort from former board President Stu Strong, we began our second house at 417 Denver Place with the Moore family on April 4th. We expect great community response from First Bible (the Moores' church), St. Andrews Presbyterian, 1st Presbyterian, Habitat Women's Build Day and GE. Harold and Kathleen Moore are so excited to begin their house! We plan to dedicate this house in June.

An added surprise for this spring is a local rehab project which is being partially funded by Valley Rubber and refurbished by Christ Our Redeemer Lutheran Church. 


